THE CLERGY LETTER

Soon after it had dropped through the letter box I eagerly tore off the wrapper. Within moments I was scanning the contents inside and was delighted when I found what I was looking for...

I must admit I do not usually get excited about the arrival of the Church Times! However, I was particularly keen to flick through the Feb 11th edition of the newspaper and check that the advert for the post of 'Team Rector in The Vale of Pewsey Team' had gone to print. The Church Times is often the first place where potential candidates will look for ministerial posts.

It was a real collaborative effort to summarise in a succinct advert what we have discerned we are looking for. We are very grateful for the input and thoughts of so many people from our local communities and churches. One of the most encouraging aspects of this task has been the clear emergence of common themes and qualities in the feedback we received.

We hope to be able to welcome a new Team Rector later this year but we are resolved to be guided by God. We are prayerfully seeking his timing and divine wisdom above and beyond our own.

"So Gideon took the men down to the water. There the Lord told him, 'Separate those who lap the water with their tongues like a dog from those who kneel down to drink.' Three hundred men lapped with their hands to their mouths. All the rest got down on their knees to drink.

The Lord told Gideon that the reduction of the army was necessary so that the people of Israel would not be able to boast that they had saved themselves. If you read on through the story of Gideon in the Bible in the book of Judges then you discover that God did indeed deliver them; just as he had promised.

In appointing our new Team Rector, we are not only seeking a person with the right qualities but specifically the person that God is calling to this important role with us and amongst us.





NURTURE NATURE

Too much fat is being fed to birds in the form of fat balls and suet pellets by well meaning bird lovers in their garden feeding stations, and the parents then feed too much fat to their young, creating conditions which could well be contributing to the decline of species. A well balanced diet on bird tables and feeders shouldn't cause any problems for our garden and wild birds. Many feeders are blown to the ground in storms and wild weather. This is a good opportunity to give them a good wash in a mild solution of warm water and washing up liquid to help combat diseases such as trichomoniasis, which adversely affects especially finch species. Also after storms ensure that nest boxes are secure, some may need replacing. Robins, tit species and blackbirds and others have already paired and even started collecting nesting material, so do take care to ensure nests are not exposed when trimming foliage, as such exposure would cause birds to desert. Last year bird numbers were well down due to inclement weather and lack of insects to feed the nestlings. Please will everyone do all that they can to protect and promote a successful breeding season, otherwise more species will be lost.
