



## Upavon Parish Council Police Report. November 2016



The Community Policing Team (CPT) model commenced in this area on 17 October 2016 and was followed by Swindon on 7 November 2016.

These follow a successful trial of the new model in Trowbridge, Warminster, Bradford on Avon, Westbury, Tisbury and Mere.

CPT combines Neighbourhood Policing, Response teams and Local Crime Investigators so there is a “one team” approach to community policing. It means there is a bigger team of officers and police staff available to attend incidents and improves communication between teams and departments. It gives the public a better service because issues can potentially be resolved at the first point of contact (101 and 999 call-takers) and provides them with a named officer/police staff member who they will be able to keep in touch with during the investigation. It also encourages officers and staff to take more “ownership” of cases.

There are seven Community Policing Teams: Swindon North, Swindon West, Swindon South, Wiltshire North, Wiltshire West, Wiltshire East and Wiltshire South. Devizes comes under Wiltshire East area.

Each Community Policing Team is overseen by a Superintendent and has an Inspector and a Deputy. The team will be made up of a mix of police officers, community co-ordinators, PCSOs, civilian local crime investigators and Specials.

We will be engaging with the public after the roll-out and will welcome feedback about the new model. ## **CPT - Current Priorities & Consultation Opportunities:**

### **Traffic matters.**

In response to ongoing complaints from members of the public, Parish Councils and Speedwatch Teams our Policing Team will be focussing upon traffic matters, particularly speed enforcement, via the use of UNIPAR devices. Positive action has been requested of our team members concerning the issue of fixed penalty notices and reporting for summons offending drivers accordingly, together with words of advice for minor infringements. Such engagement with our motorists for this period may assist in reducing risk and keeping our communities and road users safe.

Details of actions completed will be documented within our priority investigation log detailing location, times, dates and disposal summaries.

### **Non-dwelling burglaries. Pewsey villages.**

In recent months there has been an increase in non-dwelling burglaries to farm and other outbuildings in the Chisbury, Burbage, Savernake, Pewsey and Charlton area. In addition to their investigations our policing team are conducting targeted patrols to relevant areas and engaging in stop searches of vehicles and persons when grounds to do so.

These priorities will continue until the end of December 2016.

### **Hare coursing and poaching.**

We have experienced seventeen reports of coursing activity and related reports in the Devizes, Pewsey and Marlborough area between 17<sup>th</sup> October and 21<sup>st</sup> November 2016 and have created a priority investigation, to target relevant areas - Upavon and associated byways are amongst these locations.

Local incidents have included the following;

1630/24/10/16 Rushall area, dark green Rav 4 seen, with males and lurcher type dogs.

0807/10/11/16 Criminal damage to fencing on farmland, near Pewsey, by occupants to silver Mitsubishi, suspected to be for the purpose of hare coursing. A number of

units responded to the incident, including byway coverage. Enquiries completed with Thames Valley Police have identified potential users, for development.

### **Community Consultations.**

In relation to our Community Consultations; members of our Police Community Support Officer teams will be attending The Bouverie Hall in Pewsey once per month, to the local Tuesday market. We will continue to provide a monthly presence at this event in addition to our local policing of the east Wiltshire community.

We shall also be in attendance at Marlborough Market, the first Wednesday of each month.

It is also our intention to reinvigorate the local Neighbourhood Tasking Group, to ensure that we are tackling the issues that matter most to the local community.

Community intelligence is the cornerstone to successful policing outcomes. Please continue to report via 101 and directly to your local officers. Similarly any enquiries please do call 101, for advice and guidance.

### **Any relevant series for October 2016**

Coursing activity throughout the area - as previous.

Further afield we have been investigating four thefts of purses and wallets from elderly victims whilst shopping in Waitrose during October 2016. Enquiries are continuing and good progress made to date.

1845/20/11/2016 Male arrested in Avon Square following an assault upon another party and damage caused to a motor vehicle.

Update - further afield.

Non-dwelling burglary series to business premises in Pewsey, High street area. The male arrested on suspicion of a number of non-dwelling burglaries and daytime thefts from two local shops is currently in prison, having been recalled, following further offences and breaches of his bail conditions. Enquiries are still ongoing re these earlier offences.
