Over the last few months Wiltshire Police has rolled out its Community Policing Team (CPT) model across Wiltshire and Swindon.

Any large scale restructuring is naturally likely to have its teething problems but I am delighted to say that so far the response has been positive. I extend my thanks to everybody within the community for their assistance and valuable feedback, which helps us to continuously improve the way we work and ultimately helps us provide the high quality of service you all deserve and expect.

Partnership work has been incredibly important in this process and we are keen to continue, where possible, working in a joined up approach to deliver that high standard of service.

As we head in to the New Year we can look forward to seeing the results of ongoing innovation and investment within Wiltshire Police. Current Priorities Pewsey and surrounding areas.

Dwelling and non-dwelling burglaries.

Ninety two targeted patrols have occurred since this niche priority was created on the 26th October 2016 (at the commencement of CPT). During this period we have experienced five non-dwelling burglaries in total and two dwelling burglaries, of which further lines of enquiry have been identified and are continuing. This compares with 26 burglaries in the previous two months to 26th October 2016 to this area. This is most pleasing considering the expanse of area covered by the Pewsey villages.

Wiltshire Police will be continuing to limit the number of offences by pro-active policing and ongoing policing operations in these areas.

Community intelligence is crucial for us to achieve this aim so please continue to report incidents, information and any concerns.

Traffic matters.

Officers continue to focus upon this priority which includes speed enforcement. The most recent action in this area was a session in Upavon, by Special Police Sergeant TURNER on 23rd December 2016 in which four warnings were issued to motorists including the driver to a HGV.

Hare coursing and poaching.

Forty seven targeted patrols completed within this investigation, again to areas where we have experienced coursing activity. Five males were arrested early hours of the 26th November 2016 on suspicion of hare coursing and poaching offences, currently bailed pending completion of enquiries.

We have also attended a number of Road Traffic Collisions in the Pewsey and surrounding villages. We would like to remind all drivers to drive with care and to the road conditions. We have attended a number in the Upavon area on the A342 so please be mindful when driving on this road.
